The Census is a count of everyone residing in the U.S. every 10 years. Accurate reporting is critical in determining funding for communities like ours.

Fair Representation

Determines U.S. House of Representatives seats.

Emergency Response

Helps allocate disaster resources.

Program Funding

Determines funding for programs like Medicaid and school lunches.

Your Health

Helps hospitals and communities predict the spread of diseases.



Infrastructure

Drives decisions for housing, safety resources and community improvements.
